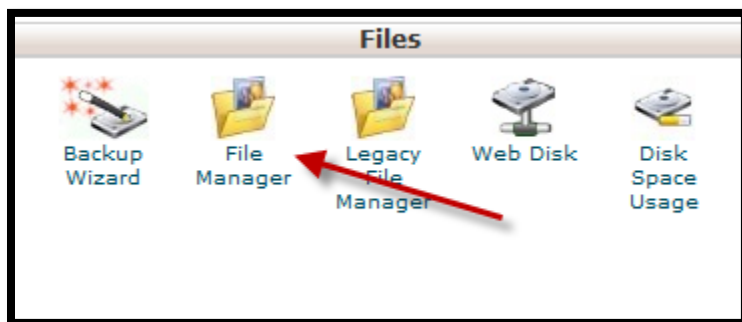


How to Install Niche Blogs on Add On Domains

Installing niche blogs on Add On Domains is very similar as installing on a parent domain. The only difference is that you need to upload the installation files under the directory that was automatically created when you added your subdomain.

1. Login to your cpanel
2. Click on **"File Manager"**

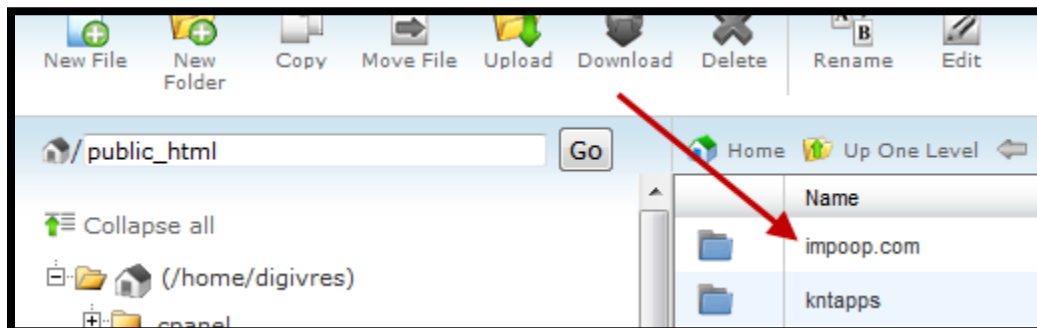


3. A new tab/window called **"File Manager"** will open.



4. Now on the File Manager page you should see the name of the directory that was created when you added an **add on domain**.

For example, if you added an add on domain called **impoop.com** you should see a directory called **impoop.com**. If you added another domain called shoppingpoop.com you should see a directory name called shoppingpoop.com and so on and so forth.



Personally, I always remove the domain extensions (.com, .net, .org etc) for my directory names when adding add on domains.

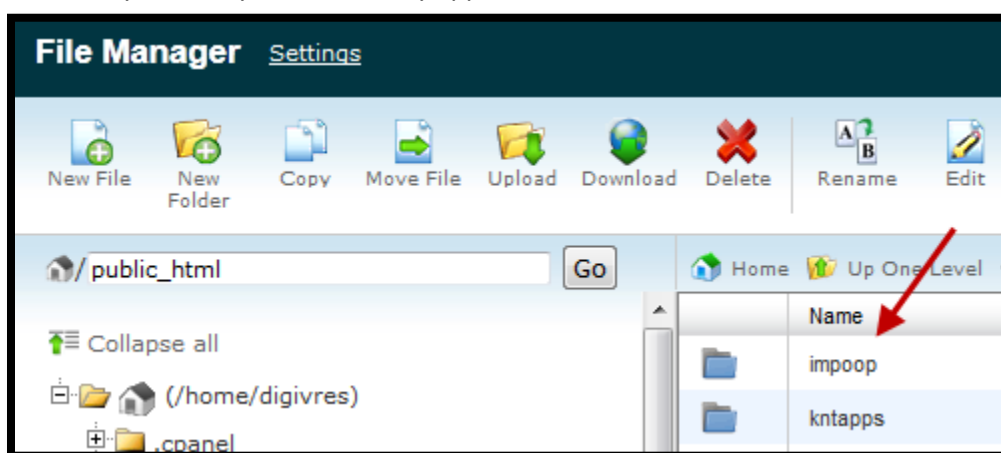

So that my directory name will only appear like this:

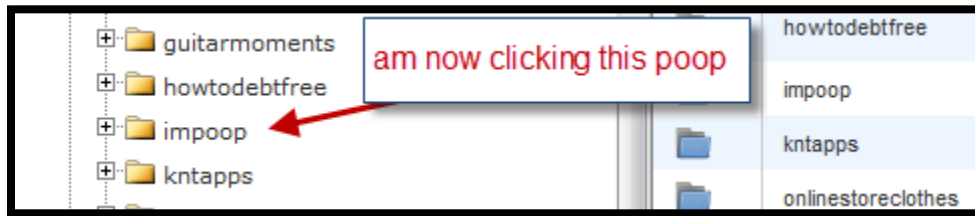


- After creating your add on domain and know where its directory was created, you can now upload the installation files.
- Click **"public_html"** folder. I always used the directory tree on right side of the file manager area to navigate on directories and subdirectories.

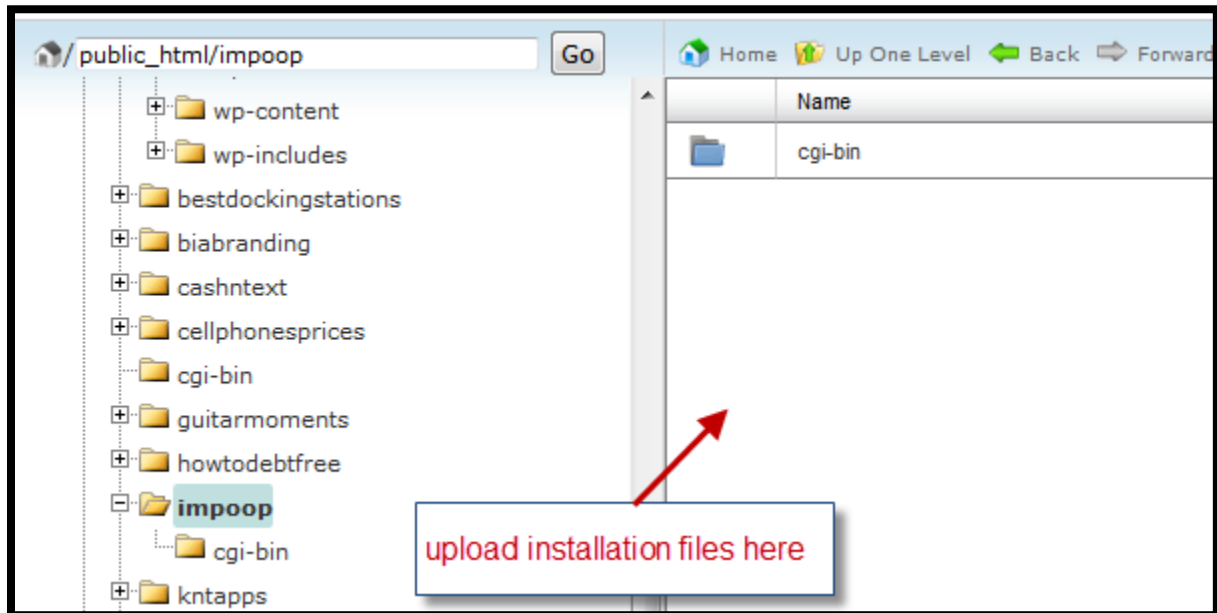


- If you have 2 or more add on domains, select the corresponding directory of the **"add on domain"** where you want to upload the installation files.

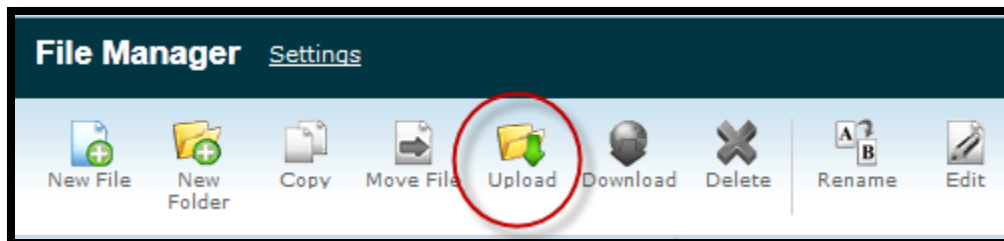
So in our example above our add on domain is called **impoop.com** so it follows that our directory should be **impoop** (as I said I personally prefer removing domain extensions for directory names).



8. You should now see on the right side of your File manager that the **impoop** directory is empty. Upload your installation files here.

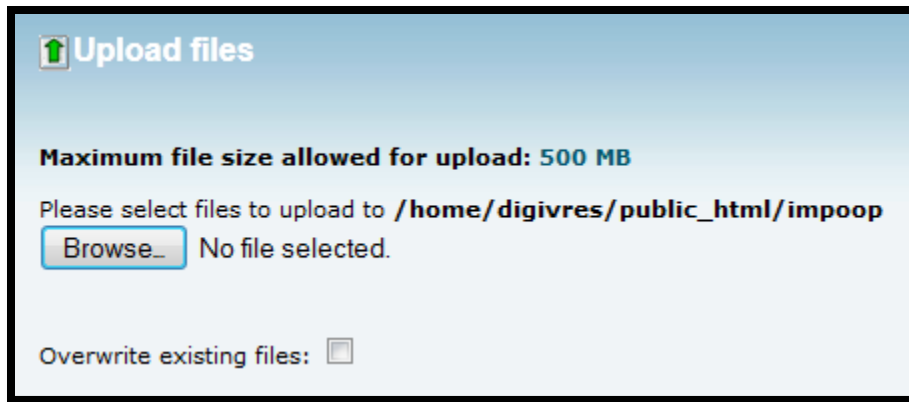


9. To upload files, click on the upload icon found on the menu items on File Manager area.



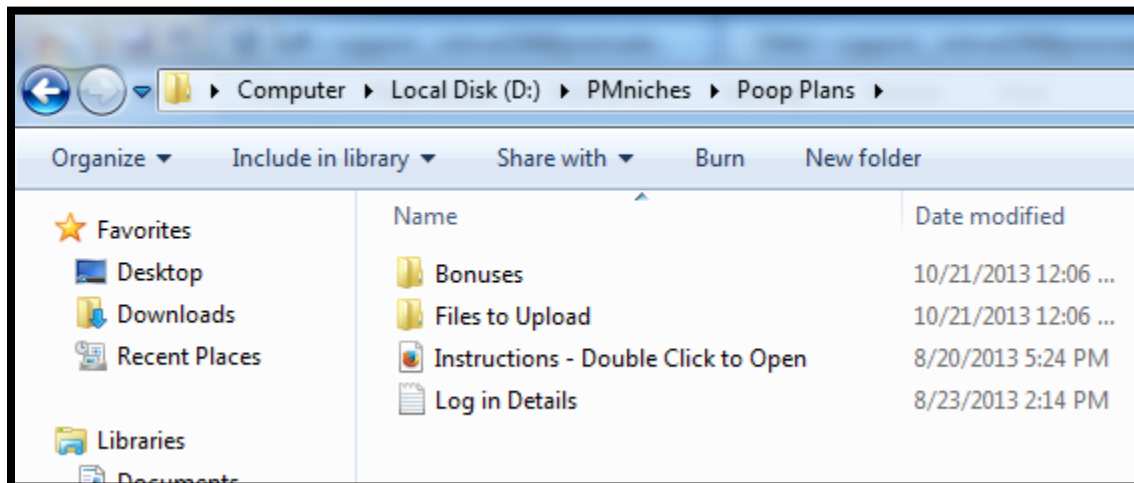
When you click the button, another tab/window will open.

10. Click browse to select the **installation files** from your computer.

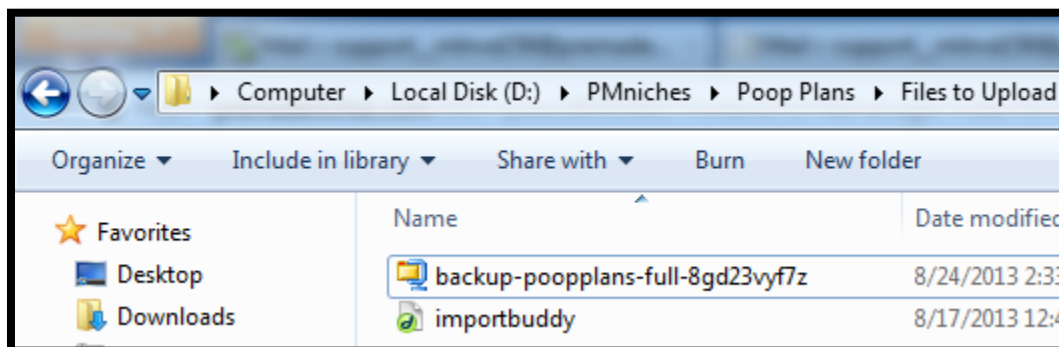


11. You should be able to navigate to the directory in your computer where you downloaded the blog installation files.

In this case, my instalaltion files are located on Drive D, under PMNiches folder. Please note that most niche blog packages from PreMadeNiches have the same contents as shown below.

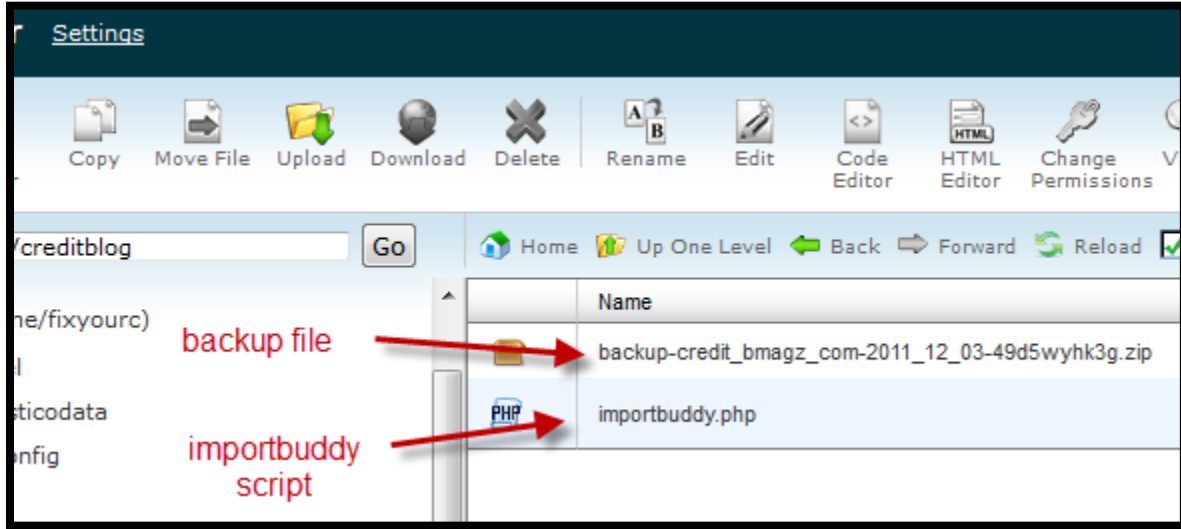


12. Open the “**Files to Upload**” folder (as shown above). You should now see the actual “*installation files*” namely the **backup file** and the **importbuddy.php** script.



13. You should now to be able to upload these files on your add on domain’s directory folder. Cpanel uploader requires that you upload each file one at a time. We’ll first upload the backup file. Double click on it and the upload should start. You should see the upload bar on the lower right side of your cpanel.

14. When uploading is complete, go back to the **File manager window** and check if installation files are successfully uploaded.



15. You can now install the whole blog by following the installation [instructions here](#).
